Welcome back to term two. We are delighted to continue to offer the children in our care a save and welcoming environment for learning. We continue to be outdoors every day, so please ensure your child/children arrive at school warmly dressed.

Scottish Government Guidance with regards to COVID 19



We are doing everything we can to ensure that the school remains open and that we operate in a safe manner. Thank you to everyone who continues to help support us by following the government guidelines for the safe opening of schools. Here are some reminders of the points to remember:

- Face coverings must be worn by all adults on the school premises and when dropping off and picking up children.
- Staff must wear face coverings in corridors, staffroom etc unless eating.
- Staff must wear a face covering if within a 2-meter distance of children.
- Classes are encouraged to remain socially distanced and to have separate playground areas.
- PE can now be taught indoors for children under 11 years; however it is encourage d that this continues to be taught outdoors as much as possible.

- Children and adults from P3 upwards are discouraged from singing in school.
- No performances are allowed where voices may be projected.
- Classroom windows must remain open for ventilation unless the temperature drops below 17 degrees Celsius. Internal doors, other than fire doors must be kept open.

New Staff and students



We are delighted to welcome Mrs Young to our team in the role of PSA. Mrs Young will be spending most of her time in the P5/6 class. We have also had Andrea join us as an Early Excellence and Equity Practitioner. Andrea will spend most of her time in Nursery supporting our children's vocabulary development. Both ladies have settled in well and are proving to be a real asset to the team.

P6/7 have the privilege of having our new student, Miss Gammack join them for seven weeks. Miss Gammack will be helping to teach the class with Miss Cargill. Miss Gammack is a welcome addition to the school and we are very happy to have her join us for a while.

Nursery



Those of you with Nursery age children will already be aware that we are now open from 9am to 3pm. We are so excited to have our children in Nursery for a longer period of time and to be able to provide them with lunch too.

Lunch Time



All children are encouraged to have a warm school meal at this time of the year. If your child doesn't like the school meal options, please provide them with a healthy packed lunch. Please note, that children will not be allowed to leave the school building at lunchtime without parents informing the school office. This is to ensure that children are always safe and in the care of responsible adults.

SeeSaw



Seesaw has been a very effective communication and learning tool for schools but following a recent ruling by the EU in relation to Privacy Shield, under which apps / software packages were covered in terms of data protection requirements, Aberdeenshire Council have been in the process of reviewing a number of apps and software packages to ensure they are satisfied they continue to be compliant with use under current legislation around data protection. SeeSaw is an app that Education and Children's Services has been looking into.

Use of SeeSaw, in terms of the way it collects users' data has been, up until recently, permitted through the Privacy Shield scheme. Now that Privacy Shield has been struck -down by the EU, SeeSaw, in its current form, is no longer data protection compliant, as data is held outside the EU. Those schools who have been using the paid-for version have the option to instruct SeeSaw to move their data to the UK and to continue using SeeSaw until the end of this school session in June 2021.

Those schools who have been using the free version have been instructed to stop using this by Friday 20th November, as they do not have the option to request, moving forward, that data should be stored in the UK.

Under these regulations, as we have been using the free version, we must stop using Seesaw as of Friday 20th November.

Presently we are looking at alternatives to Seesaw and when we have identified the right one for us, we will let you know.

Adverse weather



As we are entering winter again, we must be prepared for possible school closures due to snow and unsafe driving conditions. We try our very best to ensure that the schools is open in all weather conditions, however the majority of our staff need to travel a good distance to come to school and in the event of difficult or dangerous road conditions we may need to delay the opening of the school and in very severe cases, we may not be able to open.
